Michel Arrignon (France) President of the jury



One of the legendary clarinetists of our times he was professor at the Paris Conservatory, principal clarinet with the Paris Opera and Ensemble Intercontemporain. He was responsible for the premieres of numerous works for clarinet including L. Berio Sequenza VIII, Ph. Féneton's Latitudes, G. Grisey piece for clarinet and trombone and K. Stockhausen's Donnerstag aus Licht. He has been the clarinet teacher at the Superior School of Music "Reina Sofia" in Madrid since 2009.

He is also clarinet consultant/tester for Buffet Crampon and is contributing to the development of the instrument since 1985.



JeanSebastien Béreau (France)



Jean-Sébastien Béreau started his musical studies with 9 years old at the Paris Conservatory where he had lessons with Darius Milhaud, Olivier Messiaen, Louis Fourestier e Maurice Martenot. He was director of the Conservatory of Metz and musical director of Metz Symphony. During 15 years he was conducting professor and director of the 3 orchestras of the Paris Conservatory where he collaborated with Pierre Boulez and Leonard Bernstein. Jean-Sébastien has conducted many prestigious orchestras and soloists around the world and his former pupils are amongst the best conductors. He has been a source of inspiration for young musicians and among the various distinctions awarded to him is the "Ordre du Mérite". Currently, he is professor of Orchestra Conducting at the Lille National Conservatory.



Karel Dohnal (Czech Republik)



He is laureate of many international competitions (Prague, Roma, London, Sevilla, Ostende, Bayreuth). Karel also regularly engages in chamber music, cooperating with Tokyo, Haas, Talich, Wihan String Quartets, Prague Philharmonia Octet, and others. He is a member of Philharmonia Octet, Trio Amadeus, and Prague State Opera

Orchestra. His doctorate was focused on Contemporary clarinet Techniques. His performance of Stockhausen's Harlekin, has been highly acclaimed. Karel records regularly for the Czech Radio. Regularly gives masterclasses both in Czech and abroad. Karel is sponsored by Rico.



Antonio Tinelli (Italy)



Born in Switzerland, he graduated with honors at the Music Conservatory of Monopoli, and obtained the clarinet and chamber music Advanced Diploma at the Superior Academy of Pescara. Winner of over thirty prizes in important national and international competitions, he is also an extensive performer with concerts held all over the world.

In 2012 he released a CD in trio with Karl Leister and Giuliano Mazzoccante. A Professor of clarinet in the Music Conservatory E.R. Duni of Matera, he is also the Artistic Director of International Clarinet Competition "Saverio Mercadante".



Rui Martins (Portugal)



Rui Martins holds degrees from ESML, ANSO and Piaget Institute (pedagogy). Selmer Soloist and "Gold Soloist" RICO. He is invited regularly to perform at the ICA ClarinetFest where he appeared with the Lisbon Clarinet Quartet in Los Angeles, Oporto, Vancouver and Atlanta. Prize winner in several contests, served also as soloist with Nova Filarmonia Portuguesa Orchestra. Featured as soloist with João Domingos Bontempo Orchestra and appeared in concerts in Macau, Vienna and Brussels with António Vitorino d'Almeida. Rui Martins performs regularly with Gulbenkian Orchestra playing Bb and Eb clarinets since 1993. Currently he is a clarinet professor at the Lisbon National Conservatory and ESML.


Aniko Harangi (Hungary)



Anikó Harangi, won the 1st prize at the Béla Bartók Competition for young pianists in 1982. From 1988 she studied at the Ferenc Liszt Superior Music School . She graduated in 1992 with distinction, as a teacher and chamber musician. In 1991 she won a scholarship to Participate in a chamber music course with the clarinettist Kálmán Berkes in Tampere (Finland). Since 1993 she has been teaching piano and chamber music, and accompanying at the Conservatory Professional School of Arts of Madeira. She has accompanied classical ballet with Marcello Raciti and Mercedes Olmos. In 2004 she was awarded the Grand Prix in chamber music at the "21st Century" Association's International Competition in Madeira.
